Opening up digital opportunities for people & business and enhance Europe's position as a world leader in the digital economy.






The 3 pillars of the Digital Single Market





The Connecting Europe Facility Programme (CEF)

Infrastructure programme to support establishment of trans-European networks 2014-2020



- Supports the completion of the Digital Single Market
- Public services being not only digital by default but also cross-border by default







CEF Digital

Sector specific Digital Service
 Infrastructures: networked cross-border services for citizens, businesses and public administrations & bodies.

• **Building blocks**: re-usable digital services across domains





CEF Building Blocks



Secure crossborder authentication

eDelivery



Secure message exchange of documents and data

eInvoicing



Compliance with EU elnvoicing standards

eSignature



Create and validate electronically signed documents

eTranslation



Secure automated translation of text

The building blocks of the CEF promote the adoption of the same open standards and technical specifications, by the different sectors of the Union, for the most basic & common functionalities of any sectorial project/platform.



How do they work?

DIGITAL SERVICE INFRASTRUCTURES



CORE SERVICE PLATFORM

Central hubs of aiming to ensure trans-European connectivity, access and interoperability ...



GENERIC SERVICES

Gateway services linking one or more national infrastructures to core service platforms



Building up the DSIs

: **Start of deployment & operation of the core service platforms** supporting the entire digital service ecosystem, focus on the building blocks & mature sector-specific DSIs

: **Enlargement** to eHealth, Online Dispute Resolution, and eProcurement, plus support to the core service platforms and generic services started in 2014

: investments in the DSIs supported in the previous years continued, stronger focus on Generic Services

: inclusion of **eCard under eID** Building block

: expand the eCard core activities, news DSIs such as Fake News, Blockchain



Support to the eCard initiative

- Enable students to identify themselves in a trusted manner across borders and thus benefit from the 'Once Only Principle' in higher education institutions
- Backbone: EIDAS regulation and eID building
 block







Overarching goals within CEF

For students:

- Easier mobility between HEIs,
- Enable every student to easily and safely identify and register themselves electronically at higher education institutions within the EU
- Access to online academic & non-academic services

For HEIs:

- Reduce the administrative workload
- Simplicity and efficiency of services provided
- Lower the costs on managing users' identities





eIDAS Regulation

- The common legal framework for trust services in the EU
- Provides the necessary strong legal basis for mutual recognition
- Defines the condition for secure cross-border electronic interaction between citizens, businesses and public authorities
- Facilitate secure and electronic transactions throughout EU
- Simplify administrative procedures





CEF Projects (call 2017)



- Enhance the eIDAS infrastructure with new academic attributes
- Build new (eIDASenabled) services
- eIDAS nodes are be updated to provide the additional attributes

ESMO

- Promote eIDAS adoption
 - I. By minimising adoption costs for SPs
 - II. By facilitating the connection of sector specific data sources
- Promote convergence with EduGAIN, cooperation with other CEF and Erasmus+ projects based on common objectives (e.g. EWP)

Studies+

- Build trust for secure e-services
- Reduce time for cost consuming physical transactions
- Uptake of an ID
 Wallet mobile App
 for students based
 on eIDAS







NEW CEF Projects (call 2018)

MyAcademicID

- eID dimension
- Create a single student
 eID in Europe
- Create of a single authentication for all services (Once only principle)
- Convergence alignment and interoperability of existing tools (ESC-OLA-Erasmus+ mobile App-EWP)

SEAL

- Boost CEF eID adoption by minimising integration costs, and opening the way to new services through the access to academic information
- Facilitate the deployment of services requiring the transfer of trusted information by providing a service where users can establish links between their own identities
