

University Cooperation Programme with Africa

The Catalan Association of Public Universities (ACUP), composed by the Universitat de Barcelona (UB), Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona (UAB), Universitat Politècnica de Catalunya (UPC), Universitat Pompeu Fabra (UPF), Universitat de Girona (UdG), Universitat de Lleida (UdL), Universitat Rovira i Virgili (URV) and Universitat Oberta de Catalunya (UOC), is promoting a strategic cooperation programme with universities, associations, university networks and research centres in sub-Saharan Africa. This programme represents one of the priorities established in the International Projection Plan for Catalan Public Universities 2010 – 1015 approved by ACUP in 2009.

The main objective of this cooperation is to create stable, long-term alliances in the three main university areas: training, research and knowledge transfer. In addition, there will be a special focus on university management, an essential area for guaranteeing the efficient functioning of universities.

Following the current efforts of improving the coordination between, and the concentration of, development cooperation activities, the eight Catalan public universities and a series of African universities propose to work together in a common framework. Within this framework, there will be joint projects with the participation of all public Catalan universities as well as bilateral projects between African and Catalan universities.

• For the 2010 - 2011 period, the university cooperation programme with Africa will be centred on the following main areas:

University management:

- Spanish-African Higher Education Management Platform:
 the ACUP will create a joint platform to foster the discussion
 and reflection on some of the key topics that affect university
 management in Africa with the aim to create new knowledge
 and good practices, and to train university leaders and managers.
- Inter-university collaboration projects on university
 management: a number of specific projects, with special
 emphasis on information and communication technologies (ICT),
 will accompany the theoretical reflection and put into practice
 the main results obtained through the exchange of ideas.

Training and research:

 Platforms of reference: The ACUP will create, together with the African universities platforms of reference with a strong impact on the regional development to reinforce high level research and training capacities.

In order to initiate and lay the foundations for a close and effective cooperation with Africa, the eight Catalan universities members of ACUP together with five African universities organised throughout 2009 the first DIGU project. The African universities which participated in the project were:

- University of Antananarivo, Madagascar
- Cheikh Anta Diop University, Senegal
- Eduardo Mondlane University, Mozambique
- National University of Equatorial Guinea
- University of Yaoundé I, Cameroon

The project was funded by the Spanish Agency for International Cooperation for Development (AECID) and the Catalan Agency for Cooperation for Development (ACCD). It also had the support of the Casa Africa and the Catalonia-Africa Institute (ICA).







Institutional Development and University

Management Project (DIGU Project)





Objectives:

The DIGU project is based on four main objectives:

- To establish stable relationships with African universities
- To reinforce the institutional capacities of participating universities through training, visits abroad and mobility of university leaders and managers
- To exchange experiences and good practices
- To create a knowledge network among the participants

THE PROJECT WAS STRUCTURED IN 4 STAGES

Preparatory:

Through a series of visits to the universities participating in the DIGU project the current situation of higher education management at the African universities was analysed and specific needs in the area of university management identified.

First meeting: Barcelona - Catalonia

During one week, 15 university leaders and managers from African universities, together with 25 leaders and managers from Catalan universities, worked on a number of different topics identified as priorities in the area of university management for the African universities. The participants also had the opportunity to visit the Catalan universities.

Second meeting: Africa

Each university participating in the DIGU project organised a seminar on a subject of particular interest to their university inviting different local and Catalan experts. These seminars enabled the participation of a larger number of people from each of the African universities as well as other universities from the participating countries. During these meetings work on specific future collaboration projects between the African and Catalan universities was initiated.

Third meeting: Dakar

The first year of the DIGU project came to an end with a third meeting of leaders and managers from African and Catalan universities, which took place at the Cheikh Anta Diop University in Dakar, Senegal. This meeting was especially focused on formalising the future collaboration and specifying different future projects for interuniversity collaboration both in the areas of university management and training and research.
