About the Event

The Erasmus Going Digital event will focus on illustrating the impact of a suit of digitisation projects shaping the future of the Erasmus programme: Erasmus Without Paper, the Erasmus Dashboard, the Erasmus+ App and the Online Learning Agreement. It will feature plenary as well as practical sessions about the digitisation of student mobility in the 21st century.

During the event, we will present and discuss current developments and share with colleagues in attendance the milestones foreseen for the coming months. The conference will also feature presentations of beta versions of two new tools that will be available for testing: the inter-institutional agreement manager (which is the newest component of the Erasmus Dashboard) and the Erasmus Virtual Assistant.

We encourage you to get acquainted with the tools that are already available in order to make the most of the conference. You can easily download the Erasmus+ App and access the Online Learning Agreement platform for students to familiarise yourself with those student platforms.

You can also register on the Erasmus Dashboard (or request access from your main institutional account holder, in case your HEI has already been granted access) to manage the learning agreements of your students and edit the institutional data that students see in the Erasmus+ App.

The tools in focus

We have the pleasure to showcase the positive impact of several flagship projects facilitating digitisation of the Erasmus+ mobility.

Erasmus Without Paper (EWP - for HEIs)

The project aims to set up a network that will allow any Erasmus+ HEI which organises student exchanges to be part of an **online exchange network** and therefore exchange its student data with any EU HEI system using the network in a secure and efficient way. The project is developing an IT infrastructure and common data standards for interoperability between HEI systems. To connect to the system, HEIs can either use commercial software (such as SOP's Mobility-Online and QS Unisolution's MoveON), build a connector to their own in-house system or use the EWP – Erasmus Dashboard (see below).

Erasmus Dashboard (for HEIs)

The Erasmus Dashboard is an online space to manage outgoing and incoming students, review, decline, comment, download and sign their Learning Agreements. It also doubles as a communication platform with exchange students, easily letting HEIs send group emails and push notifications to users of the **Erasmus+ App.** Last but not least, HEIs can add deadlines and custom information that will be displayed in the Erasmus+ App Step-by-Step guides. The Erasmus Dashboard is made available free of charge as part of the EWP project to all Erasmus+ HEIs in Europe.

More than 730 HEIs have already requested access to the Erasmus Dashboard. You can consult the <u>FAQs</u> and register <u>here</u>.

Online Learning Agreement (OLA - for students)

The Online Learning Agreement (OLA) platform offers a simple and convenient way for students to complete their Learning Agreement online, have it signed,









receive comments from sending and receiving institutions as well as have an overview of the final version of the LA.

More than 19,000 Online Learning Agreements have already been generated and almost 90% of the students would advise their peers to use the platform.

The Erasmus+ App (for students)

The Erasmus+ App is a tool for Erasmus+ students and offers different services to support students throughout the mobility process. One of the services of the Erasmus+ App allows students to easily monitor the status of the Learning Agreements that they created through the Online Learning Agreement platform and monitor the signing process. Furthermore, the Erasmus+ App shows specific information from the students' home and host institutions that the institutions can edit in the Erasmus Dashboard. Lastly, the Erasmus+ App enables students to receive push notifications from their institutions, informing them about important milestones and deadlines in the mobility process.

The Erasmus+ App has been downloaded over 49,000 times already and offers a one-stop-shop for students. It is freely available on Google Play or Apple store.

European Student Card

The European Student Card will simplify mobility by enabling a easier access to student services during their mobility. The vision underlying the European Student Card (ESC) project is that of enabling students to assert their rights by connecting existing student cards to a digital system. Eventually, students should be able to seamlessly request accommodation, gain access to university canteens at student rates and access other services (e.g. library systems) beyond their own higher education institution, encouraging stronger cooperation between institutions and an increase of visiting, exchange or international students.


