

## The 2015 Science|Business Annual Summit. Innovating for Growth

19/20 November 2015

On 30 November 2015, the world's attention will be focused on the COP 21 global climate summit, in Paris. In the run-up to COP 21, the members of the Science|Business Network – leading research universities, multinationals and government agencies – will launch in Barcelona, on 19 November 2015, a joint declaration on the importance of harnessing research and innovation to confront climate change and achieve sustainable growth.

As a society, we want it all: economic growth, affordable energy, social cohesion and environmental responsibility. That's going to be impossible without new technologies and strategies: Innovations in renewable energy, materials, digital technologies, business models, regional policies and much more. In 2002, the European Council set the 3% GDP target for spending on research and innovation by 2010. It was not reached. Moving away from the spending argument, Science|Business proposes a new approach:

How to reach 3% sustainable growth through innovation?
