

Professor Paul Hagan is Director of Research and Innovation at the Scottish Funding Council. He was formerly Dean of the Faculty of Biomedical and Life Sciences at the University of Glasgow. He is an Honorary Member of the British Society for Parasitology and Fellow of the Royal Society of Edinburgh. Paul completed his BSc and his PhD at the University of Glasgow, and from 1981 spent several years at the Medical Research Council Laboratories in The Gambia, West Africa, where he worked on the immunology and epidemiology of human schistosomiasis. He continued his research at the National Institute for Medical Research, Mill Hill, London, returning to Glasgow in 1991. Between 1995 and 1998 he served as a DFID-sponsored Detached National Expert at the European Commission in Brussels, managing the parasitology research component of the International Cooperation (INCO-DC) programme. He serves as an advisor to the World Health Organization on General Parasitology and to the Schistosomiasis Consortium for Operational Research and Evaluation (SCORE) which is funded through the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation.
